Dearest friends,


For several years now, I have loved being your ACI web- and social media lady, or to use the internet lingo : your "ACI webby" ©.

Accounting Policies

Presentation of annual financial statements

The annual financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the International Financial Reporting Standard for Small and Medium-sized Entities and the Annual Financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, and incorporate the principal accounting policies set out below. They are presented in Euros.

1.1. Financial Instruments

Financial instruments at amortised costs

Debts instruments, as defined in the standard, are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Debts instruments which are classified as current assents or current liabilities are measured at the undiscounted amount of the cash expected to be received or paid, unless the arrangement effectively constitutes a financing transaction.

At the end of each reporting date, the carrying amount of assets held in this category are reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence of impairment loss is recognised.

1.2. Revenue

Interest is recognised, in surplus or deficit, using the effective interest rate method.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and represents the amounts receivable for goods and services provided in the normal course of business, net of trade discounts and volume rebates, and value added tax.

a. LCI-ISP 2017-19 HAPPY HEARTS

HAPPY HEARTS



Thank you to the ladies of LCI for voting the Happy Hearts project as the ISP 2017/2019

Since coming back from Sonderborg last year we have been doing a lot of planning around the building with the technical team (the architect, engineers and quantity surveyors). All the services provided by the technical team are valued at about 16,000 Euro have all been donated. The planning involved finalising the drawings of the structures and also getting the building permit. As I type this now I'm glad to report that we are almost done with the process of getting the technical aspect of the building in order and we have been promised by the technical team that we should have our building permit in about a months' time.



HH Fundraising and Awareness Initiatives

Press briefing where we informed the public about LCI's commitment to the Happy Hearts project.





Gold Fridays- where circlers wear their HH pins and try to sell as many as they can.



Because of our commitment to HH, the Baylor Institute has included us in the community partners forum that meets quarterly to discuss ways of better serving the oncology needs in the country (great honour).

Launched a campaign called ' buy a brick'. We go to shopping malls every last Saturday of the month and set up a stall where we sell pins, and other HH merchandise. We also give out pamphlets that talk about different kinds of childhood cancer so that we raise awareness as well. This campaign has been well received by the public as we will be asking for just BWP 10 (cost of one brick) which is less than 1Eur. A majority of people end up donating for 5 bricks or more.



We hosted a gala dinner to launch the fundraising campaign and we invited the President of Botswana to be our guest of honour. This was a great success as we got a lot of companies participating and pledge their support. The President donated an equivalent of about **9,700 Eur** on the night. We have companies that have pledged that they would like to build a room etc....We raised **16,200EUR** on this night.

One of our circlers will be summiting Mt Kilimanjaro between the first and 11th of August and all the funds raised go towards Happy Hearts. She has managed to raise about **5,500Eur** so far





We have since received other donations to the project that are about 7,305 EUR





In total we have raised **38,500 EUR** and look forward to the support of all the ladies around the LCI world to help us raise the funds needed to make the home a reality.


Ladies' Circle, Round Table and Agora Club Italy have designated Club 41 Italy as their official representative to sign the tender.

BACKGROUND

communities whose healthcare fail them, is evident in the many kilometres and hours they travelled for screening and in the hope of receiving help.



II. To modify the rule 4.7.1

Current Rule

- 4.7.1 The ACI Board is allowed to collect the digital data of all Agora members to create a digital database for the use of the ACI-Board only.
 - a. The ACI Board is allowed to publish the digital data of the national Boards of the Agora Countries in the ACI-App which will be provided to every Agora member.
 - b. Any Agora country can have all their members published in the app without any added costs.

New Rule



- 4.7.1 The ACI Board is allowed to collect the digital data of all Agora members to create a digital database for the use of the ACI-Board only. The ACI Board, will make use of the data for Agora business only and respect the General Data Protection Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and the European Council, applicable as of May 25, 2018.
 - a. The ACI Board is allowed to publish the digital data of the National Boards of the Agora Countries in the ACI-App which will be provided to every Agora member.
 - b. Any Agora country can have all their members published in the app without any added costs, **provided each Agora Country respect its local rules on general data protection**.


Explanations

These modifications aim to further clarify and protect the personal data of our members.

As you all might know, on 24 May 2016, the new General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR") entered into force (Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EU).

This regulation is a response to rapid technological developments and globalization, and also aims to remove barriers to the flow of personal data within the European Union. The regulation aims to provide a strong and consistent framework for data protection in the European Union, which is supported by strict enforcement. Unlike the previous directives, this Regulation is directly applicable and enforceable in the Member States, without first having to be transposed into national law. Companies and associations had until May 25, 2018 to adapt to the new rules.

It also covers the transfer of personal data to third countries and international organizations. Transfer of personal data may still take place in particular cases or when there are appropriate safeguards (standard data protection clauses, binding corporate rules, contractual clauses).



III. To add the rule 4.8

4.8 Supportive Role to the Agora International Board

4.8.1. Web-lady



The ACI board will appoint a web-lady, who will be an Agora member and , whose function is not part of the Agora Board. The web-lady will be appointed for a period of two years.

Explanation

The ACI board wants to share the information about Agora Club International and its members in real time. Therefore, the ACI board feels the need to have the support of a web-lady who will be a member of an Agora Club with good and sound knowledge on internet related issues. She is not part of the ACI Board, only assists the ACI Board upon request. She will be designated for an initial period of 2 years.

16. PROPOSAL FOR EXTENSION TO THE RULES BY THE AC COUNTRIES

> PROPOSAL FOR EXTENSION TO THE RULES FROM AC BELGIUM

1) Cleaning version of ACI Rules

<u>explanation</u>

The main reason for the proposed modifications is consistency in the vocabular. In additions we aim the avoidance of misunderstandings in the terms and of useless repetitions, the deletion of mistakes and to make the document readable for all of us.

To avoid inconsistency, we created "definitions" as soon as the word is used for the first time in the document and the given definition is furthermore used throughout the whole document in a consistent way. Definitions start with a capital letter.

Voting by show of hands

2) To modify the Rule 3.5.4.

Current Rule

3.5.4 If the membership of a Full or Associate Member Country has been terminated for reasons stated in rules 3.5.1 and/or 3.5.2 then the outgoing Board of that former country can no longer hold a function in the National Board of any Agora Country.

New Rule

3.5.4 If the membership of a Full or Associate Member Country has been terminated for reasons stated in Rules 3.5.1 and/or 3.5.2 then **members of** the outgoing Board of that former country **may** hold a function in the National Board of **its own country**,



when the latter country becomes again a Full Member Country or in the National Board of another Agora Country upon the following cumulative conditions:

(a) prior to becoming a Full Member Country, the relevant country must have paid all outstanding Affiliation fees and Capitation fees of the previous years due to the ACI;

(b) the member

- (i) is a member of a national Agora Club for at least three years;
- (ii) fulfilled a position in the board of a local Agora Club;
- (iii) got the consent of the National Board of the relevant Agora Country.

Explanation

There might be special circumstances, known only in the relevant Country, that implies that the current rule is too severe. As soon as the relevant Country paid the fees due, the ACI could consider to accept the country as an Associate Member Country and a Full Member Country when two National Clubs are set up. If the former members of the National Board of a Full Member Country that left the ACI fulfil the conditions mentioned above, the ACI might have sufficient safeguards for an enthusiastic lady(ies) who will endeavour that her country will fully comply with the ACI Rules and consider to give a second chance.



3) To add a Rule 9 called: ACI International Service Project (the "ACI Project" of "ACI ISP")

9.1. ACI has an International Service Project, which is voted on at the ACI AGM every second year. Every full Member Country can propose a new project. The chosen project can be re-elected. The project is preferably, not mandatory located in an ACI Country, anyway an ACI Full Member Country must always be responsible for overseeing the Project.

9.2. The National Treasurers need to collect the monies raised in their Country for the ACI Project and pay them to the following ACI ISP Account whenever there is a reasonable amount to pay with confirmation of all donations sent to the ACI Treasurer.

The ACI Treasury will transfer the funds to the ACI Project whenever there is a reasonable amount to ensure the continuing funding of the ACI Project.

9.3. The ACI Full Member Country hosting and/or responsible for the ACI Project must open a separate account for the ACI Project and is responsible to provide a written report on the progress of the ACI Project at least once a year (at the ACI AGM) to all the Full Member and Associate Member Countries.



9.4. Immediately after the ACI Project has been chosen at an ACI AGM, the ACI Treasurer will transfer an amount of Euro 1,000.- to the ACI ISP account.

Respectively, at the end of each ACI Project, Euro 1,000.- is left on the ACI ISP Account for the next project.

9.5. Applications for a new ACI ISP Project should be sent to the ACI Secretary on or before the 30th of June prior to the ACI AGM of that same year with a detailed description of the intended ACI Project.

Explanation:

During the ACI Conference in 2015 in Brasov, the ACI Councillors decided for an own ACI ISP project and decided to allocate funds to the project "Eyes for the World". During 3 years, the ACI very successfully conducted the project. Not only for transparency reasons, the rules governing the choice of a project, the finances of a project and the reporting requirements need to be written down and reflected in the ACI Rules.

The proposed text is a copy paste of the text used in the LCI Constitution and Rules, with some minor changes.

Voting by show of hands

- 4) To add a Rule 10. RULES FOR THE ACI ISP FUND
- 10.1 The Charity to receive the collected funds shall be decided every second year in advance. A National Treasurer can pay donations to the ACI ISP Account at any time during the year.
- 10.2. Interest earned from funds in the ACI ISP Account shall be added to the sum to be donated to the chosen charity.
- 10.3 ACI Full Member Countries and the ACI Board can propose a project. An ACI Associate Member Country can propose a project with the support and approval of its Godmother Country or another ACI Full Member Country.
- 10.4. One of the ACI Full Member Countries shall have the administrative, legal and financial responsibility of the project. This task shall be allocated to the ACI Full Member Country that proposed the elected ACI Project. In case of a proposal by an ACI Associate Member Country, this task might be allocated that ACI Associate Member Country under supervision of the ACI Board or to a third Full Member Country.
- 10.5 Countries can only propose one project at a time. The proposal must first have the approval of the National Board of the country applying for the ACI project



in case of a Full Member Country or of the Board of the local Agora Club in case of an Associate Member Country. A short explanation in writing (100 - 150 words) concerning the intended use of the funds shall be sent to the ACI Secretary by the 30th of June prior to the immediate following ACI AGM and to be presented at that same ACI AGM.

- 10.6 A vote shall be taken at the ACI AGM between the suggestions received.
- 10.7 As of the moment of the vote for the ACI Project at an ACI AGM, all funds collected and paid by the National Boards will be allocated to the elected ACI ISP Project (see 10.11). All the administrative costs of the ACI Project are to be taken care of by the National Board of the Agora Country being in charge of administrative, legal and financial responsibility of the project as stipulated in Rule 10.4. above.
- 10.8 The ACI Treasury can make the first payment to the ACI Project as soon as a reasonable amount has been collected. The following payments shall be made after a report is given to the ACI Board concerning the proceedings of the ACI Project and sufficient assurance is given regarding the progress.
- 10.9 The National Board of the Full Member Country having proposed the elected ACI Project shall be responsible for overseeing the ACI Project and for ensuring that the monies are used for the intending charity. In the absence of a National Board the ACI Board or the National Board of a Full Member Country named in the ACI AGM would undertake that responsibility.
- 10.10 The ACI Board has the right to intervene in the ACI Project if the requirements mentioned above are not fulfilled.
- 10.11 The time limit for donations to the ACI Project is the 30th of June in the second year of the ACI Project. Money received later will automatically go to the next project, if any, elected at the immediate following ACI AGM.
- 10.12 An AC Councillor or her representative appointed by the country hosting the ACI Project and receiving the gifts/donations shall give a brief report on the proceedings of the ACI Project in the three subsequent ACI AGMs after the ACI AGM, where the ACI Project has received the vote.

A written half year report shall be delivered to the ACI Board six months after the ACI AGM. This report should be distributed to all the National Boards. A written full year and financial report should be delivered to the ACI Board not later than 30th of June prior to the ACI AGM. This report should be distributed to all the National Boards.

10.13 Enquiries concerning the ongoing ACI Projects shall be answered within 30 days by the ACI Board.



- 10.14 If for any reason it proves impossible to use the allocated funds during the two years following its receipt, it shall be returned to the ACI ISP account and the amount added to the funds available for distribution to the next ACI Project to be decided at the next ACI AGM.
- 10.15 Every ACI ISP should last for two years and may be re-elected.
- 10.16 The host Country of the ACI ISP is responsible to submit an audited report on completion of the ACI Project, no later than the following ACI AGM.

Explanation

See above under 2.

The basis of the proposed text is found in the text used in the LCI Constitution and Rules.

Voting by show of hands

5) Modification of Rule 1.6.

Current Rule

A decision to wind up or suspend the matters of the Association can only be made at an Annual General Meeting (hereafter referred to as AGM), at which not less than two- thirds of the total votes of those present and entitled to vote are cast in favour.

New Rule

A decision to wind up or suspend the matters of the Association can only be made at an Annual General Meeting ("ACI AGM" or "International AGM"), at which not less than two- thirds of the members entitled to vote are present and 75% of the total votes present vote in favour.

Explanation

This Rule seems to be in contradiction with rule 6.9.4. - No new rules or amendments to the ACI Rules may be made except by the decision of the ACI Council at the ACI AGM at which at least 75% of the members of the ACI Council present, vote in favour. Therefore, there is a quorum requirement and a majority requirement for the decision to wind up or suspend the matters of the Association. The winding up of the Association is considered as a modification of the Constitution and/or of the Rules of the Association.

6) Modification of Rule 6.9.3.

Former Rule

Voting shall normally be by show of hands (cards). In the election of ACI Officers (50%+1) and ACI Conference venue (50%+1), or when specially requested, voting shall be by secret ballot.

<u>New Rule</u>

Voting shall normally be by show of hands (cards). In the election of the ACI Officers, the ACI Conference Venue and **the ACI ISP**, or when specially requested, voting shall be by secret ballot.

Explanation

If the ACI Councillors accept the modifications of the ACI Rules with regard to the ACI Project, we need to add the ACI ISP in this Rule, to be voted on by written ballot.



7) Modification of Rule 6.7.

Current Rule

If a councillor is unable to attend the meeting of the Council, an accredited deputy may attend in her place.

<u>New Rule</u>

If **an AC** Councillor is unable to attend the **ACI AGM**, an accredited deputy may attend in her place.

Explanation

Rule 6.7. is part of the section "Rules Governing the AGM of AGORA INTERNATIONAL". By mistake the word "council" is used (see clause 5.6.) and must be replaced by "ACI AGM".



8) Modification of Rule 6.9.4.

Current Rule



No new rules or amendments to the ACI Rules may be made except by the decision of the ACI Council at the ACI AGM at which at least 75% of these members, vote in favour.

<u>New Rule</u>

No new rules or amendments to the ACI Rules may be made except by the decision of the ACI Council at the ACI AGM, at which **2/3 of the members of the ACI Council entitled to vote are present and** at least 75% of these members, vote in favour.

Explanation

For amendments to the ACI Rules, two conditions have to be met as we have seen before: 1. A quorum (2/3 of the members of the ACI Council entitled to vote are present) (see clause 8.2). 2. Majority requirements (75% of the members of the ACI Council present vote in favour). These two conditions are not yet correctly reflected in the Rule under review.



9) Modification of Rule 8.3., 2nd sentence

Current Rule


Voting on all proposals shall be by show of hands except when a written ballot is specifically requested, this in case of election of the ACI Officers and the ACI Conference.

New Rule

Voting on all proposals shall **normally** be by show of hands, except when a written ballot is specifically requested **and** in case of **the** election of the ACI Officers, the ACI Conference **venue and the ACI ISP**.

Explanation

If the ACI Councillors accept the modifications of the ACI Rules with regard to the ACI Project, we need to add the ACI ISP in this Rule, to be voted on by written ballot. Is also added the ACI Conference venue instead of ACI Conference (cfr clause 6.9.3.), because the ACI Councillors vote on the place where the Conference will take place.





10)Modification of Rule 8.7.c.

Current Rule


When an amendment has been proposed, it must be voted on and must be settled before any other amendment can be considered. A straight majority is needed to accept the amendment.

New Rule

When an amendment has been proposed, it must be voted on and must be settled before any other amendment can be considered. To accept the amendment, at least 75% of the members of the ACI Council present must vote in favour.

Explanation

This is in contradiction with rule 6.9.4. - No new rules or amendments to the ACI Rules may be made except by the decision of the ACI Council at the ACI AGM at which at least 75% of the members of the ACI Council present, vote in favour. Therefore the amendment cannot be voted with a straight majority, but needs a majority of 75%.

this Applexus since 2009. I have also worked for several non profit organizations as well as a property management company. I have a Bachelors as well as Masters degree in Accounting and Finance from India.



REPORTS OF THE AGORA COUNTRIES 2017-2018 A. FULL MEMBER COUNTRIES

1. REPORT AGORA CLUB BELGIUM

Dear Agora Friends,

I had a wonderful and heart-warming year with my board!

We started this year with regional

meetings, voted at the AGM in June 2017. Now, Belgium is divided into 5 regions, three of which are already active. The three clubs in charge of the organisation of a regional meeting succeeded to set up pleasant and unforgettable meetings!



In September 2017, a charter meeting took place in Waterloo, attended by ladies from AC Livourne-Saint-Emilion. Both clubs signed for a twinning of their two clubs.

BELGIUN

In October 2017, thirty-five (35) Belgian Ladies accompanied by ten (10) husbands participated at the International Conference in Malta. Their job was to inspire international Ladies to come to Ghent on October 4th 2018, to attend the international Conference with the moto "Vreewijs". All these Belgian Ladies did a fantastic job because the "break-even point" has already been achieved this day!

End October 2017, we also celebrated the 50th anniversary of our sister association, Ladies Circle Belgium, in Tienen.

I visited twice our northern neighbours. In January 2018, I attended the annual New Year's reception in Schoonhoven (the Netherlands) with Marleen Bollen, and in April 2018, I attended the Charter of a new club "De Kempen", with Yvonne Houben.

Marleen also went to the LCI MTM in Luxembourg, where she met Ursula and Anna. Two hundred and sixty (260) ladies from twenty (20) different countries participated at that meeting. The lively discussions and the excellent atmosphere stroked her.

In February 2018, I was present at the charter meetings in Haifa and Israel, together with friends from Germany, America and Romania. In March 2018, 4 ladies (Mimi, Beatrice, Florence and myself) were present as godmother at the charter of Casablanca 5 in Morocco. Both showed us their social projects: (1) AC Haifa invited



us in a shelter for women of different nationalities; (2) AC Casablanca showed us a shelter for non-married mothers, where one tries to bring together family and the "guilty" men. We were invited to two traditional weddings as well.

The HYM meeting of Round Table International took place in Ghent, under the chairmanship of Yann Tavernier, chairman of RTI. Isabelle Seguinot (Int. President) and Veerle de Jonge (Past Int. President) attended the HYM AGM. Ingrid and I joined them later at the late-night party.

With five (5) friends from Agora Club Lokeren-Waasland and twenty-five (25) international ladies, we celebrated the 5th anniversary of the Agora Club in Stavanger-Norway.

I wonder now how I did it all because I also participated in our International Service Project ("ISP"). I went to two countries with very different cultures: (i) Romania (with Veerle, Dirk and Jos, my partner) and (ii) Madagascar (with Veerle and Carla from the Netherlands). It is very touching to give a new opportunity in life with only 20 euros (in the villages around Brasov, Romania, we helped mainly older people and gypsies and in Madagascar we helped thousands of children). During these missions, we learned that communication and follow-up are very important for our ISP. We learn in practise! In countries such as Madagascar (with almost 25 million people, 65% of whom are under 25 years of age) it is therefore very important that we teach the teachers in the schools the importance of the spectacles for the children in the classrooms, in order to avoid that the given spectacles are worn by other family members or even sold in the worst-case scenario. The conclusion is that there is still a lot of necessary work to do to convince them!

All this is possible thanks to the continuous efforts of Veerle and Sandy, the convenors of the ISP and the gifts of all Agora clubs.

I am also very proud of the good cooperation with the four Clubs ("4C1V") in Belgium. Our representatives, Pascaline and Mimi, worked hard on it and two beautiful projects: Christmas in a Box and the weekly food distribution for the homeless in Brussels are continued with enthusiasm.

With the help of Agora she received clothing, medical assistance and food parcels ensuring her and her family had food on the table. Christmas was celebrated in a cold July on the mountain, the November ACI was celebrated at the Albasini Dam and the week away in Hoedspruit as Isabelle our ACI president was hosted in true Amarula Style. The SPCA continued to be supported in a number of ways, money was donated for the SPCA Mandela Day and a "pack "in the SPCA Quiz nights was entered into. Amarula supported Ladies Circle, TNR, Berg Care, the Old Age Home, the De Gois family and coat hangers were donated to the Od Age home for their fete.

Agora Amarula also received knitted garments from Agora friends in Germany and The Netherlands, which were handed over to Agora Club Kopano to take to some hospitals and to Agora Club Strelitzia for their Matchbox Babies project.

(20 in Sandnes, 13 in Egersund)


Soon we will charter the third club, with 8 members. The new club is also in Sandnes.
